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
★ For years bus drivers have asked to be included in ★

The State Elementary CCRPI score is a 71.7, so WHES is beating the state average by 5 points. Our CCRPI score has come up dramatically from a 58.8 in 2012. A huge shout-out to our faculty and staff for the steady gains in academic achievement over the last four years!
