What are the requirements for graduation at HCHS? KI

English/Language Arts 4 Mathematics 4 Science 4 **Social Studies 4** CTAE and/or Modern Language and/or Fine Arts 3 **Health and Physical Education 1** Flectives 6 TOTAL UNITS (MINIMUM) 26

** Must have 2 years of a foreign language to attend a 4 year college/university

Honor Graduate Requirements (must meet all) ki

- Cumulative GPA of 90 or better
- Successfully complete one Advanced Placement or core content Dual Enrollment class AND a combination of 3 or more additional Honors, Advanced Placement or core content Dual Enrollment classes.
- Successfully complete 2 consecutive world language classes
- Earn a grade of 70 or higher in all courses attempted (no failed courses)
- No level 3 discipline referrals

**students completing a core course on e2020 are not eligible



Helping your Senior Plan for the Future **K**

Our goal as educators is to ensure every student has a plan after high school to be....

- Enlisted (in the military)
- Employed (in the workforce)
- Enrolled (in a college/university)

If you plan to.... You should..... к

- Be Enlisted- talk to a recruiter, take the ASVAB
- <u>Be Employed</u>- attend resume/interview workshops with our Career Counselor, attend job fairs, build skills
- <u>Be Enrolled</u>- explore colleges online or go on tours, take the SAT/ACT, apply early, look for scholarships, keep your grades up!

How do I Apply to College? ki

- Research potential schools (reach, match, & safety)
 www.gafutures.org
- Review each school's admission requirements and deadlines
 - Complete the online application
 - Send your test Scores (ACT/SAT/Accuplacer)
 - Send a transcript (www.gafutures.org)
 - Pay the application fee
 - Request teacher recommendations if needed

Ways to pay for college KI

- Grants & Scholarships
 - Do not have to be paid back
 - Based on specific requirements
- Loans
 - Must be repaid after college and with interest
- Work-Study Programs
 - Student has a job on campus
 - Money earned pays for tuition

What is HOPE? KI

- 3.0 HOPE GPA in core curriculum courses (English, math, science, social studies, and foreign language)
- Must meet rigor requirements (4)
- Pays a portion of standard tuition at public institution
- Must maintain 3.0 GPA at checkpoints
- Maximum hours is 127/semester
- Must be a GA resident for 12 months

What is ZELL MILLER?

- Must meet rigor requirements (4)
- Designated valedictorian or salutatorian OR 3.7 HOPE GPA <u>and</u> 26 ACT or 1200 SAT(CR/M)
- Pays for full standard tuition
- Must maintain 3.3 GPA at checkpoints to keep
- Must be a GA resident for 12 months

Financial Aid Workshops KI

FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid and ALL college bound students must complete this application every year they plan to attend college.

Graduation Night and Dress Code:

Graduation is Friday, May 19th at 8PM.



Attendance is unlimited, but you will be given 3 parking passes. We will have shuttle buses.

You need to arrive NO LATER than 6:30PM. This is to ensure that you do not get caught in traffic. We will have a dress code check and wait in the Fine Arts Building. We will line up to go on the field at 7:30.

DRESS CODE: Graduation Dress code must be followed or you will not be allowed to walk.

Ladies: Dress that will not hang below gown or black dress pants and black or navy dress shoes. (Remember, you will be walking on grass/gravel and up and down a ramp.)

Gentlemen: White collared shirt, black or navy dress pants and <u>black</u> dress shoes. No blue jeans, not even dark ones.
