

Superintendent Brett Stanton Named Member of the American Association of School Administrators (AASA) Century 100 Club

Superintendent Brett Stanton was recently selected to serve as one of two school system superintendents representing Georgia as a member of the American Association of School Administrators (AASA) Century 100 Club. Mr. Stanton's selection for membership was approved at the luncheon of the Century 100 Club held on February 13th as part of the 2014 AASA National Conference held in Nashville, TN.

Founded in 1925, the AASA's Century 100 Club is an honorary organization that facilitates a cross-country exchange of ideas and fosters educational leadership among superintendents. It consists of two superintendents from each state, and each retiring active member nominates his or her replacement. Retired Fulton County Schools Superintendent and current President of the Georgia Partnership for Excellence, Steve Dolinger selected Mr. Stanton for membership along with the endorsement of John Zauner, Executive Director of the Georgia School Superintendents Association (GSSA). The club consists of 100 active superintendents (two from each state), 90 associate members, and 11 honorary members. Also, the club represents the longest standing tradition of professional activities supporting the mission and vision of AASA.
